Employee Spotlight— Jen Buszka

This month's employee spotlight is Jen Buszka, a utilization review specialist at Shodair. Jen has worked at Shodair for the past 15 years and prior was a department head at a Mental Health Nursing Facility and Early Intervention Services with Family Outreach for those with developmental disabilities. UR staff provide clinical information to Medicaid and insurance companies to keep patients stay clinically authorized, so the hospital receives payment for the patients' care. "We complete initial authorizations prior to admission and continued stay authorizations throughout the patients' stay," she said. UR also coordinates with facilities for discharge planning to other facilities outside of Shodair. 'We work closely with admissions to communicate both admission and discharges to assist in keeping patient beds full in the facility," she said. Jen enjoys advocating for the young people we serve so they get the services they need.

Jen says Shodair has changed a lot in her time by increasing services and improved communication, culture, and collaboration, which makes it a positive work environment and healing for patients. "I think the future is (at Shodair) promising," she said. "For some time there has been such a shortage of mental health services for children and adolescents across the state often limited by payment sources. Shodair is opening much needed services to support these youth. "

During her free time, Jen enjoys cooking, telemark skiing, running, reading, just about anything outdoors, and spending time with her family, friends and pets. She and her husband Scott have a dog and two barn cats. She also started Rock Steady Boxing here in Helena with her dear friend Sus. It is a high intensity exercise program for individuals who have Parkinson's Disease. This is neuroprotective for individuals who have Parkinson's by slowing their disease progression, helping managing symptoms, and increasing their quality of life. Jen says non-contact boxing addresses the symptoms of disease. i.e. slow movement, mobility, flexibility, agility, speed, coordination, balance, and overall fitness. "The program also becomes a great social network program and support for these individuals to fight back against there disease," she said. "We have participants from ages 52 to 86 in our program. They are such a fun group to be around! You see the shift in boxers within about the first 30 days of participating. Its hard work but they come in with a smile, walk better, and move better. The program is held 3 days a week."

Jen is knowledgeable about the needs of patients; is easy to collaborate with as a team player; and not afraid to speak up even when difficult. Her colleagues say she is always willing to lend a helping hand, and is 100 percent dedicated to a job well done. We are fortunate to have Jen in the Shodair family!
